**The theme is “*Latest Challenges to Intelligence Oversight in a Democracy*”.** The Malta event would be the third edition of an annual event, which is planned to be organized in a rotating way with the Forum being held in different countries and continents to enhance the participation and engagement of stakeholders everywhere across the globe.

**The participants** are members of intelligence oversight bodies as well as representatives of intelligence agencies and NGOs.

**The 2018 forum is a closed door event with plenary and thematic sessions.** The forum also adopts and applies the “Chatham House Plus” rule of confidentiality meaning that not only should comments not be attributed to speakers but before being cited at all formal explicit written permission should be obtained from the speaker concerned. The forum will consist of 7 thematic sessions. Each of these thematic sessions will address topics, which have been identified as being of key importance in previous editions of the Forum. Each session will be followed by a Q&A session, thus enabling all participants to contribute to the discussion. It is also important to note that there are no plans to open the meeting to the media at any stage.
